



Martin Luther King Jr. was an **A**merican Christian minister and activist. He became the most visible spokesperson and leader in the Civil Rights Movement from 1955 until his assassination.

El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz better known as Malcolm X, was an **A**merican Muslim minister and human rights activist. During the civil rights movement he was a popular figure.

The Ku Klux Klan, commonly called the KKK or the Klan, is an **A**merican white supremacist hate group, whose primary target are African Americans.



The Montgomery Bus Boycott was a political and social protest campaign against the policy of racial segregation on the public transit system of Montgomery, Alabama. It happened on the day before **F**riday.




Rosa Louise McCauley Parks (February 4, 1913 – October 24, 2005) was an **A**merican activist in the civil rights movement best known for her pivotal role in the Montgomery bus boycott. The United States Congress has called her "the first lady of civil rights" and "the mother of the freedom movement".



The March on Washington was held in Washington, D.C. on Wednesday, August 28, 19xx. The purpose of the march was to advocate for the civil and economic rights of African Americans. **E**stimates of the number of participants varied from 200,000 to 300,000.



Jim Crow laws were state and local laws that enforced racial segregation in the Southern United States. All were enacted in the late 19th and early 20th centuries by white Democratic-dominated state legislatures after the Reconstruction period. The laws were enforced until 1965 and were like **H**ell for all PoC.


